

Troop 113 Code Of Conduct

As a Boy Scout and a member of Troop 113, I agree to behave in a manner that is consistent with the Scout Law. By being part of the troop and in order to participate in troop activities I agree to the following:

I am expected to follow the posted or verbal schedule of activities and assignments specified by the troop leadership.

I am expected to be on time for all troop events.

I will follow the Scout law, Scout Oath, and Outdoor Code, and I will remember that these are the basis for all the following rules and should be the basis for all of my actions.

In addition:

Each Scout will show respect to Adult Leaders, other Scouts, parents, and guests.

Listen and pay attention to others at all times. Foul language (cursing) will not be tolerated at any time.

Physical – or – Verbal Abuse of other Scouts is not acceptable.

Roughhousing, fighting or "threats" to Scouts by other Scouts will not be allowed.

Each Scout will respect other Scout's property at all times.

Nothing will be taken or used that belongs to another Scout without that Scout's permission.

If you break another Scout's property, you will pay for it – if you had permission or not.

During the meetings the Scouts will not be allowed to leave the meeting areas for any reason, unless an Adult Leader has granted permission, and the proper supervision. This includes leaving with a parent.

The meeting area will be kept neat and left clean including the bathroom area.

I will treat troop equipment with care and leave it in the same (or better) condition that I got it

You will wear either the Scout or (Class A or B) uniform at every meeting unless told not to by the Scoutmaster.

We will strive to work as a TEAM at all times.

Non-compliance with any of the above Code will result in the Scout facing one or more of the following actions:

- One-on-one meeting with Scoutmaster, Assistant Scoutmaster or other adult leader.
- Parental notification
- Scout and parent(s) present themselves before the Troop Committee.
- Possible suspension or removal from Unit

Troop 113 maintains a record of Code of Conduct documents that have been signed by each Scout and his parent(s) have indicated that they have read, discussed and understand Troop 113's Code of Conduct and will comply with it to the best of their ability.
